
2025 Greater Reno Stamp & Cover Show By Erik Fields, Chairman

The 2025 Greater Reno Stamp and Cover Show was held July 26 and 27. Eleven dealers and the United States Post Office was on hand to serve 208 visitors on Saturday and another 105 on Sunday.

Of the eleven dealers, eight were returning dealers which included Ed Dimmick, Peter Gutter, Roger and Rachelle Gutzman, Mark and Dale Baker, Kyle Nybo, Dave Blackhurst, and Jeff Waldman. Also returning to the show after many years was Keith Kaufman. In addition, we had two new dealers this year.





Jim Forte from Las Vegas, brought in a diverse selection of quality covers. On cover that caught my eye was a German cover from the small town of Kothen. It was franked by a single 1000-mark stamp (Scott #204). This rate was only in effect from August 1 through August 24, 1923, during Germany's inflationary period (See image on left).





Another newcomer was Peter Schwartz of Los Angeles. Peter brought in a fabulous selection of nineteenth century United States Stamp proofs. However, his specialty was United States revenue stamped paper. In the nineteenth century, stamped paper was an efficient way of collecting documentary taxes by having the document pre-stamped with the required tax, as with the check from The Bullion and Exchange Bank of Carson City for \$65 (see above image).

The Post Office was on hand to sell stamps and apply this year's cancel on our show covers. Saturday's cover commemorated the 250th anniversary of the United States Post Office. Sunday's Cover celebrated the 50th anniversary of the Nevada Stamp Study Society.

Note: The Bylaws state: "Any member of the Nevada Stamp Study Society in good standing, who is 18 years of age or older, shall be eligible to hold any office in the Society or to serve on any committee, provided however, that a candidate for the office of **PRESIDENT** shall have previously served either as an elective officer, or as a member of the Board of Directors, or as chairman of a standing committee."

I spent my early years between Sausalito, Palo Alto, and Santa Cruz before living in London, England for two years attending the Guildhall School of Music and Drama (I sing, act, and play guitar). Having bombed out it Hollywood in the mid-1970's, I returned to college and received a B.S. in Earth Science from UCSC and got my Masters in Geology at Oregon State University. I worked for years as a scientist at environmental consulting firms and finally worked for Naval Facilities Engineering (NAVFAC) in San Diego for about 15 years. I finally retired on December 31st, which is giving me time to get all these stamps organized, scanned, and listed!"

Issued by some countries with regularity, by others never, semi-postal stamps (also called charity stamps) have been around for well over a century. Carrying a surcharge on the regular postal rate, they have been used to raise funds for a variety of causes and organizations, ranging from war victim, indigent, and disaster relief to cultural institutions and groups, medical research, health programs, and environmental causes.
